One Stop Shopping with Style

"Box stoves, first made from five cast iron plates bolted together and set on a three- or four-legged hearth plate with an extended rounded ash tray in front of the door, were commonly known in the mid-1700's. From the early days of making these stoves, the iron workers experimented with casting the stove boxes as a single piece rather than in plates. The fewer the parts that had to be joined, the fewer places for air to get in the stove and therefore the greater the control over the rate and temperature at which fuel burned. Stoves that were cast in this way were often called Shaker stoves".
